C.S. Lewis was born in Belfast, Northern Ireland, in 1898, and died in Oxford in 1963. He held the Chair of Medieval and Renaissance English Literature at Cambridge University. He wrote more than thirty books, ranging from literary criticism to children’s stories. “If wit and wisdom, style and scholarship are requisites to passage through the pearly gates, Mr. Lewis will be among the angels.” - *The New Yorker* (Review of *The Great Divorce*).
